# Our 2020 Accomplishments

While the global pandemic curtailed our ability to travel to Haiti after March 2020, we are grateful to have been able to travel in January to Port de Paix, a remote location in northwestern Haiti. In Haiti's healthcare system, primary care is not consistently available. Cervical cancer, which is preventable, is still the number one cause of cancer in Haitian women. There is no coordinated Haitian emergency medical system. Primary Care Haiti focuses on capacity building: educating Haitian physicians, nurses, and other medical professionals to provide them with the skills necessary to prevent disease and respond to emergencies around the country. Thanks to our generous donors, PCH executed a week-long in-person training program covering these topics.

We are exceedingly proud to share that Primary Care Haiti held several more trainings in the summer of 2020, thanks to our volunteers in Haiti. While our US-based volunteers could not travel at this time, our local volunteers stepped in to conduct emergency medicine trainings in Port-au-Prince.

# Training at L'Hôpital Immaculée Conception de Port de Paix Beraca La Pointe, January 2020

#### Training Session Summary:

- Total Number of Attendees: 378
  Attendees came from more than 11 different
  Regions of Haiti, including Port au Prince,
  Cayes, Mole St Nicholas, Bassin Bleu, Jean
  Rabel, Bombardopolis, La Pointe, Saint Ange
  Sonia, Port de Paix, and Iles de La Tortue
- Patients Treated (by our students, under trainer supervision):
  - 150 colposcopies (examination for detection of cervical cancer)
  - Fourteen patients had positive test results
    - Five patients received treatment (thermocoagulation) for cervical cancer
    - Eleven patients scheduled a cervical biopsy with local gynecologist
- Number of Attendees in each course taught:

EMS Courses (including Basic Life Support (BLS), Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS), and

Pediatric Emergency Courses (PALS): 77 Physicians, Nurses

Cervical Cancer: 21 Physicians and Midwives Ultrasound Course: 14 Physicians and Midwives

Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP) Hands on Training: 18 Nurses



- Total number of participants who received BLS certificate: 40
- Total number of participants in Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) course: 14
- Total number of participants who received ACLS certificate: 2 The ACLS class requires completion of the BLS, electrocardiogram (EKG) and ACLS classes, for 32.5 hours total of coursework. The low rate of certification was due to the participants' ability to attend all required training hours and conflicts with patient care responsibilities

The primary function of the Ultrasound Program in PCH is to teach healthcare workers how to image various aspects of the human body so proper diagnoses can be made, leading to the right care of our patients. Ultrasound is a non-invasive procedure that uses sound waves to quickly help diagnose a patient. It encompasses OB/GYN, FAST, small parts, vascular, echocardiography and abdomen. Healthcare workers well-trained in these areas can use the knowledge they have received to better serve their patients.

It is PCH's sole purpose to teach healthcare workers ultrasound, so they can share and apply their knowledge and skills to save lives. The anticipation for our arrival and the joy we see on the participants faces after gaining the knowledge is what makes us keep going back to Haiti to share all we can to improve the lives of the community.
